Psalm 33: 10-12 NIV ¹⁰ The Lord foils the plans of the nations; he thwarts the purposes of the peoples. ¹¹ But the plans of the Lord stand firm forever, the purposes of his heart through all generations. ¹²Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord, the people he chose for his inheritance.

The principles upon which the United States was founded are deeply intertwined with the concept of divine providence and individual liberty. Many of the Founding Fathers, while diverse in their personal beliefs, often spoke of a higher power's role in the nation's destiny. They believed that true freedom was not merely the absence of oppression, but the ability to live according to one's conscience, guided by moral principles. benevolent God have been central to the development of America from its very beginning.

We all know the lyrics to this song and most likely sing it with great love for our country and all it stands for. This song was written by Irving Berlin who was born in Russia in 1888 and originally named Israel Baline. He and his family fled to America to escape Russian persecution of Jews. They arrived in New York in 1893 and made Manhattan their home.

Irving went on to serve in our US Army and penned this song while stationed at an Army camp during WWI. Much like many hymns we sing, this song is truly a prayer put into a melody. **This prayer is from the heart of an immigrant who experienced what it meant to live among the free and believed a country that followed God would remain in His blessing.**

This is a powerful message, reminding us where to put our hope and trust in those dark or uncertain times. This independence day, and throughout our lives may the words of this song and the heartfelt prayers of an immigrant be on our lips. May we also believe as we are faithful, our God will always watch over us. May we pray for American hearts to return to serve our God faithfully, for blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord.
