I AM Sends You

Exodus 3:7-15 NIV

⁷The LORD said, “I have indeed seen the misery of my people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out because of their slave drivers, and I am concerned about their suffering. ⁸So I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey—the home of the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites. ⁹And now the cry of the Israelites has reached me, and I have seen the way the Egyptians are oppressing them. ¹⁰So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt.”

¹¹But Moses said to God, “Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?”¹²And God said, “I will be with you. And this will be the sign to you that it is I who have sent you: When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you will worship God on this mountain.”¹³Moses said to God, “Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, ‘The God of your fathers has sent me to you,’ and they ask me, ‘What is his name?’ Then what shall I tell them?”¹⁴God said to Moses, “I AM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: ‘I AM has sent me to you.’”

¹⁵God also said to Moses, “Say to the Israelites, ‘The LORD, the God of your fathers—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob—has sent me to you.’ “This is my name forever, the name you shall call me from generation to generation.

1. **The Mission is God’s.**

2. **The Power is God’s.**

3. **The Faithfulness is God’s.**

Conclusion: Because **I AM** is with us, *His presence*—not our strength—makes us faithful instruments. Go forth in confident hope wherever **I AM** leads you.

LIFE GROUP LESSON

I AM Sends You

Week of March 15th, 2026- March 21st, 2026

Ice Breaker: What is something bigger God put in front of you and said GO and do in My name? What was your response?

Read Exodus 3:1-15.

4. How does Moses encounter God initially? (vs.1-4)
5. Why might God appear in this way?
6. What was Moses’ response to what he saw and heard?
7. What did God establish right away? (v.5)
8. Who did God reveal Himself to be? (v.6) Why is this significant when God is calling Moses? What is He making known?
9. What is on God’s heart? (v.7) What does this tell you about how God sees and responds to your trials and hardship?
10. Who is going to rescue Israel? (v.8) Whose mission is this? Why is this important to understand and remember?
11. Why did God tell Moses all this? (v.10) What is Moses’ role?
12. How does Moses respond? (v.11)
13. What might Moses’ hesitation stem from?
14. Have you felt the same at some point? How did God respond to you?
15. How did God respond to Moses’ insecurity? Who does God focus on? (v.12)
16. Why is God’s response significant for us to pay attention to? What does God want us to know when He calls us to serve in some way?
17. What does *God is with us* mean practically in how we live?
18. Read Matthew 28:18-20. What does Jesus reveal? Do we believe this? What is our response as He tells *us to GO* and make disciples? Whose power are we acting in? Whose mission is it?
19. How does God respond to Moses’ question, “whom shall I tell them sent me?” (v.14) What is the magnitude of this name? What does this name mean to you?
20. Read John 8:58. What truth does Jesus reveal? What does this mean regarding the covenant and God’s faithfulness to uphold it?
21. When you doubt or feel afraid, how might remembering *I AM is with you*, help you go forward?
22. What else did God state about His name and how we are to refer to Him? (v.15) How is this tied to the covenant promises? How is this tied to Jesus? How is this tied to knowing God as our portion forever?

Point to ponder: The great **I AM** goes with us, so we follow in faith —relying not on our ability, *but on His constant presence*. He is sufficient!
