

The Mosaic Covenant

I Will Redeem You

Sunday, March 22, 2026

Exodus 6:1-9 NIV

Then the LORD said to Moses, “Now you will see what I will do to Pharaoh: Because of my mighty hand he will let them go; because of my mighty hand he will drive them out of his country.”² God also said to Moses, “I am the LORD.³ I appeared to Abraham, to Isaac and to Jacob as God Almighty, but by my name the LORD I did not make myself fully known to them.⁴ I also established my covenant with them to give them the land of Canaan, where they resided as foreigners.⁵ Moreover, I have heard the groaning of the Israelites, whom the Egyptians are enslaving, and I have remembered my covenant.

⁶“Therefore, say to the Israelites: ‘I am the LORD, and I will bring you out from under the yoke of the Egyptians. I will free you from being slaves to them, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with mighty acts of judgment.’⁷ I will take you as my own people, and I will be your God. Then you will know that I am the LORD your God, who brought you out from under the yoke of the Egyptians.⁸ And I will bring you to the land I swore with uplifted hand to give to Abraham, to Isaac and to Jacob. I will give it to you as a possession. I am the LORD.”⁹ Moses reported this to the Israelites, but they did not listen to him because of their discouragement and harsh labor.

1. **The Lord Redeems by Delivering His People.**
2. **The Lord Redeems by Providing a Substitute.**
3. **The Lord Redeems by Revealing Himself.**

Conclusion: God delivers. God provides the Lamb. God reveals Himself as Redeemer. What started at Passover is fulfilled in Christ.

LIFE GROUP LESSON

I Will Redeem You

Ice Breaker: What battle have you faced where God said be still and watch what I will do?

Read Exodus 6:1-9.

4. What will cause Pharaoh to release the Israelites? (vs.1)
5. Who does God say He is? (v.2) What is the power in this name?
6. What is different in what He shares and reveals with Moses? (v.3)
7. What is God revealing in what He desires?
8. What does God affirm with Moses prior to the Exodus? (v.5)
9. What does God want the Israelites to know? What specific actions will He take for Israel? (v.6)
10. What is God stating He will do and offer to Israel? (v.7)
11. What is all of this for? Why is this so important to know? (v.7) What does God want us to remember in how He moves in our lives?
12. In remembering His covenant what does He promise? (v.8)
13. What was the response of Israel in hearing this? Why? (v.9)
14. Have you responded in similar fashion to sermons or a Word someone shared with you? Why? What might Israel or you have needed?
15. Read Exodus 9:15-16. This was after six plagues on Egypt. What did the Lord make known to Pharaoh?
16. Did you notice God raised Pharaoh up for God's purposes? Why would He do this? What does this reveal about God?
17. Read Exodus 11:1, 4-7. What is the final plague? Why would God bring this upon Egypt? What was the significance of the first born?
18. Read Exodus 12:1-7. What was Israel to do to be spared? Who was the substitute for Israel from God's judgment? Where else has God provided a substitute for death?
19. Read Exodus 12:12-14. What was the sign to the Lord? What would He do when He saw it? What were they to do going forward? Why?
20. Read 2 Corinthians 5:7-8. Who is Jesus and how is this Scripture calling us to remember Passover in our daily living?
21. Read Exodus 14:13-18. What did Moses say to Israel as the Egyptians were pursuing them? Who would fight for them? How?
22. Read Exodus 14:31. Through the events of the Exodus what happened? What was the purpose for this mighty act of God?
23. Read John 17:3. What is eternal life? What is most important?

Point to ponder: Consider the events of the Exodus and how the establishment of Passover positions us to remember the Lamb of God.
