Here am I. Send Me.

Isaiah 6:1-8 NIV

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple. ² Above him were seraphim, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. ³ And they were calling to one another: “Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory.” ⁴ At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke.

⁵ “Woe to me!” I cried. “I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty.” ⁶ Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. ⁷ With it he touched my mouth and said, “See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for.” ⁸ Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, “Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?”
And I said, “Here am I. Send me!”

1. **Encounter His Holiness.**
2. **Recognize Our Brokenness.**

Conclusion: The holy God who reveals our brokenness is the same God who provides our redemption. And those who have been touched by His grace don't simply walk away grateful—they become available. Our hearts begin to say, “**Here am I, Lord. Send me.**”

Ice Breaker: Have you had an experience that changed the way you saw yourself or life?

Read Isaiah 6:1-8.

1. Why is the death of the king recorded before the vision (v.1)
2. Read 2 Chronicles 26: 3-8, 16. What do we see about King Uzziah's reign and the nation of Judah?
3. How might his death create anxiousness over the nation?
4. In this state of uncertainty what does God show Isaiah? (v.1)
5. What is the purpose of this vision? Who is he focused on?
6. What did Isaiah see next? Why? (v.2)
7. What were they saying? (v.3) Above all what and who is God?
8. What happened as they spoke? (v.4) *Can you see this vision?*
9. Read Revelation 4:1-8. What did John see and encounter? What were they saying? What is the significance of these visions?
10. How often are you caught up in the holiness of God Almighty?
11. In seeing this, what did Isaiah realize about himself? (v.5)
12. What happens as we draw closer to our Holy God? What do we see and realize about ourselves, the closer we get?
13. What happened next? (vs. 6-7) What is this foretelling?
14. Is this a message of condemnation or hope?
15. Read Romans 8:1. What is the hope we have in Christ?
16. Why might God want us to see who we truly are apart from Christ? Why might He want us to the power of holiness?
17. What happens in our heart when we realize the depravity of our human condition? Why is this necessary to follow Christ?
18. Read Matthew 5:3. Who are the blessed ones? Why?
19. What did God do next? (v.8)
20. What had to happen first before God extended an invitation? Read Hebrews 4:16, Romans 3:23.
21. How did Isaiah respond? (v.8) What prompted this response?
22. In that moment did Isaiah know what he was signing up for?
23. Why might his heart say, send me, without knowing the details?
24. What is the key to his confidence and willingness?
25. What should we be fixing our eyes on? What should we be speaking on our lips over and over again?
